During this time, he is to complete a drug and alcohol assessment and follow the recommendations, attend victims impact panel, violate no laws, submit to 6 random drug test, pay fines and cost in the total amount of \$1,053.00 by February 8, 2017. On August 10, 2016 the Probation/SORNA Office received a referral from Mr. [REDACTED] attorney representing the defendant for courtesy supervision. SUBJECT: Substance Abuse Subtle Screening Inventory (SASSI-3)

Dear Judge,

On 6/2/16, the Healing to Wellness Court (HWC) Coordinator conducted a SASSI-3 on Mr. [REDACTED] and the results indicate he has a High Probability of having a Substance Dependence Disorder.

A. Presenting Problem:

Mr. [REDACTED] is a 53-year-old, American Indian male and a member of the Cheyenne and Arapaho tribes. He came in voluntarily to obtain a SASSI evaluation following his arrest for Possession of marijuana, and drug paraphernalia.

B. Results of Screening for Probability of Dependency:

Mr. [REDACTED] completed the SASSI-3, a brief screener for substance dependence disorder. The results follow:

From examining the items that Mr. [REDACTED] endorsed on the SASSI-3, the following information was revealed:

- He has a history of drug/alcohol abuse.
- He has a history of legal problems.
- Relationship problems have stemmed from his drinking.
- He endorsed having used drugs or alcohol too much or too often.
- His father was a heavy drinker.

C. Interview:

The SASSI-3 was conducted at Cheyenne and Arapaho Judicial Courts in Concho, OK. Mr. [REDACTED] wore appropriate attire and was cooperative and forthcoming during the interview. The HWC Coordinator explained the test results. He reported that he would comply with any court-order educational course or treatment plan. This provider received information from Mr. [REDACTED] that he would be willing to obtain Outpatient treatment. The SASSI screening totaled 30 minutes to complete. A feedback session will be scheduled at a later time.

D. Clinical Recommendations:

- 1) Mr. [REDACTED] would benefit from a detox program for a minimum of 10-14 days to reduce bingeing and reach a point of stability and exercise early sobriety, and
- 2) Mr. [REDACTED] would also benefit from Inpatient Treatment for minimal of 45 days to gain insight about his substance abuse, or
- 3) Mr. [REDACTED] would benefit from 18-20 (minimal) weeks of 12-step meetings to build coping skills, and establish a support network.

This is not a comprehensive mental health evaluation, but a specific evaluation to answer specific court questions. If you have any questions or need additional information, feel free to contact me at (405) 422-7450.
